

NOTICE FOR NEGOTIATED PROCUREMENT (Small Value Procurement-Individual Consultant)

HIRING OF INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY THERAPY SESSION MODULES FOR THE PROGRAM HEALING INTERVENTION LEADING TO OPTIMUM MANAGEMENT (Paghilom) FOR THE REHABILIATION FOR VICTIMS OF TORTURE AND ENFORCED DISAPPEARANCE AND THEIR FAMILIES

DSWD NNP No. 19-GOP-DFAT-SVC-003 (PR No. 2018103580)

- The Republic of the Philippines, through the Social Technology Bureau (STB) Funds, of
 the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), intends to apply the sum
 of Three Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP 300,000.00) being the Approved Budget for the
 Contract (ABC) as payment for the "Hiring of Individual Consultant for the
 Development of Individual and Family Therapy Session Modules for the Program
 Healing Intervention Leading to Optimum Management (PagHILOM) for the
 Rehabilitation for Victims of Torture and Enforced Disappearance and their Families"
 (DSWD NNP No. 19-GOP-SVC-003)
- To facilitate the immediate selection process, the DSWD proceeded with the procurement short of award, pending the approval of the 2019 General Appropriation Act (GAA), pursuant to Section 7.61 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 9184 (RA 9184), Section 192 of the General Provisions of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 National Expenditure Program (NEP) and Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Circular Letter No. 2018-83 dated 30 July 2018.
- 3. The project aims to engaged a consultant who will develop modules that will ease the physical, emotional and spiritual pain, arodety and trauma of torture victim-survivors and the traumatic loss and unresolved grief or "complicated mourning" (where trauma and grief coincide) of family members/relatives of victims of enforced disappearances.

4. Scope of Work:

The Consultant shall develop the necessary tools and materials in developing modules on individual and family therapy modules relevant to the needs of the victims of torture and enforced disappearance, to be used by various service providers (i.e. social workers, civil society organizations, faith-based organizations etc.) Specifically, the Consultant shall

Section 19. Timely Procurement Planning and Early Procurement Activities. Xxx. undertake the following activities with close coordination with Social Technology Bureau focal person/s:

- Consultant will perform the services in the manner and in accordance with schedule and any other terms;
- Review and collate the result of the Writeshop on the Development of Modules for Victims of Torture and Enforced Disappearance along with other relevant activities of the programs;
- Conduct data collection activities such as review of related literature, focus groups discussions and/or key informant interviews with identified victims of torture and enforced disappearance and their families and/or individuals/groups who have worked with such type of clientele;
- Identify specific content of modules to include learning methodologies and approaches to be used in the session guides considering the different cases and situations of the clients who have been forcibly abducted and/or tortured;
- Draft the modules of the program integrating gender-sensitive learning methodologies and activities through the use of indigenous materials and approaches depending on the cases and situations;
- Develop evaluation tool for measuring the applicability and relevance of the therapy modules to the needs of service providers, identified victims of torture and enforced disappearance and their families, to be used during the pre-testing of the draft module;
- Pre-test the modules in pilot areas in Regions IX and XI; and
- Finalize the therapy modules, session-guides and evaluation tools and present to the Regional Project Management Team for approval of the OIC Bureau Director and Assistant Secretary for OSEC Group.

The Consultant should have the following qualifications:

- Baccalaureate or advance degree in allied Social Sciences, focusing and must have an
 expertise and specialization on the field of individual and family therapy and
 counseling, psychosocial and rehabilitation and having experience in promotion of
 family well-being;
- Must have relevant experience in the field of counselling (individual, child, couples), family therapy and familiarity in handling cases and situations of victims of human rights violation;
- c. Has previous experiences in developing, writing and editing books/manuals/modules on various topics in handling/healing and rebuilding the lives of Torture and ED victims, unresolved grief, healing and complicated mourning; and
- d. Highly proficient in written and oral communications skills, fluency in English is essential.

Nonetheless, the DSWD will hold payments of Consultants in case they are unable to issue an (OR). If the DSWD is the sole source of income of the Consultant, he/she may avail of the substituted filing and will not be required to issue an OR, in which case a Notice of Availment of Substituted Filing of Percentage Tax Return shall be submitted by the Consultant.4
